Care, Comfort and Hope for our Veterans

What is the cost of hospice care to veterans and their families?

Medicare, Medicaid, TriCare and the VA cover 100% of costs with no out of pocket expenses to the veteran and family. Even if you are uninsured or underinsured, we will provide care regardless of ability to pay.

Veteran Benefits

Many veterans are not aware or have not utilized all the benefits they are entitled to. We recognize that understanding and accessing these benefits can be complicated and cumbersome. Our knowledgeable Veteran Liaisons are committed to assisting veterans access VA and state veteran benefits. Some of the services and benefits we routinely assist with are:

- Obtaining discharge documents, medals and awards
- Enrolling in the VA healthcare system
- Applying for VA survivor benefits
- Burial in veteran cemeteries and military honors
- Obtaining a VA burial marker and Presidential Certificate
- In addition, our Veteran Liaisons perform dignified service recognition ceremonies wherever the veteran resides.

Hospice Care Team

Because advanced illness affects much more than physical health, a hospice care team is made up of people with different kinds of training and skills.

Doctors work closely with hospice's medical director.

Nurses provide skilled care and information for patients and families.

Home Health Aides assist with personal needs.

Trained Volunteers provide companionship, emotional support and practical assistance.

Social Workers help patients and families deal with the emotional challenges and decisions facing them.

Spiritual Care Team provides spiritual support within a patient's and family's personal belief system.

Veteran Liaison provides care and support that reflects the contributions made by our men and women in uniform.

Bereavement Coordinators provide grief support and counseling for up to 13 months following the death of a loved one.
