Daybreak Adult Services Brings Patients Joy & Caregivers Peace of Mind

Hospice has a variety of partners that help support patients in the community, but a particularly longstanding and special relationship has been with Daybreak Adult Services.

Christina Forbes, Director of Daybreak since 2008, says that the two organizations have been working together for "as long as she can remember." The adult day center's mission of providing attentive daytime care for seniors alongside opportunities for fun and socialization perfectly aligns with Hospice's goal of cultivating joy, comfort, and positive experiences even at end-of-life. "We find that time at Daybreak can bring patients happiness that they might not have otherwise," Christina says. "It takes some of their focus off of illness and related worries."

Hospice often refers patients to Daybreak when they would benefit from additional social time, or when it would be a help to family caregivers who need a break. "Hospice nurses visit and communicate with our nurses,"

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Every day we have activities, and patients get the opportunity to interact. Even for hospice patients, as long as they can still be engaged, it works."

Margie Donnelly is the daughter and caregiver of hospice patient Helga Ebel, who has been attending Daybreak for four years now. "She entered hospice about six months ago," Margie says.

Helga copes with some end-of-life challenges, such as dementia and vertigo from strokes, but the Daybreak program has been supportive for her and for Margie's role as caregiver. "Because of the way my house is laid out, and her mobility issues, I can't shower her at home," she says. "Her hospice aide visits at Daybreak and gives her a full shower once a week."

Robert Hawkins's mother Alberta attended Daybreak for almost ten years, even as she was in and out of hospice during the last few years of her life. "When we first started her at Daybreak," he says, "she had been receiving in-home care, and her world had become very small. Almost immediately she started to come out of her shell again. Just the opportunity to get out of the house more regularly and have social time made a huge difference. We can't say enough good things about the Daybreak program."

Alberta also loved the Daybreak activities. Before her dementia became too advanced, she participated in gardening, music, dance, and quilting, to name a few. As a family caregiver, Robert appreciated the scheduled time to grocery shop and catch up on things around the house. He says he was consistently impressed by the facility staff and had peace of mind in his mother's care time there.

The long-standing partnership between Frederick Health Hospice and Daybreak Adult Services offers patients not just care, but meaningful connection, joy, and support for families during some of life's most challenging times.

Honoring Family, Supporting Community: John Verbus's Hospice Commitment

When Hospice Board President John Verbus joined the board in 2018, the organization was hardly new to him. John served as Frederick Health Hospital's COO from 2007 until his 2018 retirement, and he supervised Hospice's executive director. Still, it was a welcome chance to work more closely with an organization that had been important to him not only professionally, but personally. Hospice has given much to John and several family members.

Having been engaged with hospice as a field for much of his career ("In graduate school, my first project was actually to do a presentation about hospice care," he says), he lived through several personal experiences with hospice during his time as Frederick Health COO.

His father passed away in 2009, his mother in 2013, and his brother in 2017 – all at Kline House. That's a lot of loss for anyone, but John says that Hospice made the critical difference. "My family's pain was managed, we had plenty of visits and even some happy moments," he recalls. "I can't say enough about the value of that experience... all of them had a 'good death.'" Kline House provided such a service to their family that as John's brother began to decline, he agreed to move all the way from California to receive his end-of-life care in Frederick.

John feels it's only right that he give back to this organization that has been a rock during some very difficult times. He also hopes to spread the word about hospice and generate more understanding in the wider community. "Not enough people understand what hospice is really about and the benefits it offers to patients who are suffering – sometimes not even doctors and practitioners. I would love for more families to experience the level of care that Hospice provided to my loved ones," he says.

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Helping Students Heal


Did you know that the Hospice bereavement team provides individual grief counseling for Frederick County Public School students?

Today, through a state grant, grief counselor Laura Fernandez, LCPC, is solely dedicated to providing inschool grief counseling. Laura supports both Spanishand English-speaking students. She has been able to see 46 students for a total of 221 sessions so far this school year (SY 2024-2025). She travels to 24 different schools in the county. In a continuing trend from last school year, Laura has seen a racially diverse group of students (see graphs).


A significant number of students have had a primary loss (parent or sibling) and several students have lost their loved one from a traumatic death such as overdose, suicide, or homicide. Often students are referred to the Camp Jamie program, grief support for grades 1-12 for continued support; campers can also be referred to the in-school grief counseling, creating wrap-around services for grieving students. Hospice plans to continue this vital work to support grieving children in the community.

Bereavement services are offered at no charge to anyone in the community and are funded largely through grants and donations.

ESPC's Caregiver Conference & Elder Expo This Fall!

Hosted by the Elder Services Provider Council (ESPC) of Frederick, the event will celebrate its 30th anniversary in 2025, having grown to welcome 700 seniors and nearly 70 exhibitors in 2024. Organizers say the Elder Expo offers a truly comprehensive look at local elder services.

The event features attorneys, long-term care experts, physical therapists, exercise and nutrition resources, free health screenings, and on-site flu vaccines for seniors.

Hospice Chaplain Wes Parks

Wes Parks serves as Hospice's Chaplain for Montgomery County. He has recently been blessed with the opportunity to expand from

home visits to a partnership with a facility in Olney. Kimberly Thompson,

the activities director at HarborChase at Olney, worked with Pastor Wes for a few years at the Frederick Spring Arbor facility. She was more than happy to invite him to serve in Montgomery County when she transferred there several months ago. "I've always really enjoyed working with Pastor Wes," Kimberly says.

Wes' work with Cadence is part of Hospice's growing partnership network. "HaborChase didn't yet have a Protestant non-denominational Bible study," he says, "so I was able to connect with Kimberly to begin offering weekly Christian fellowship for residents." Wes says he gathers a group of up to five or six residents every week, and they participate not only in Bible study but in sharing feelings, life updates, and praying for and encouraging one another.

Speaking on the value and the support the sessions have added to the HaborChase community, Pastor Wes says that many of the participants were active in home churches that they now are unable to visit nearly as often. The Bible study provides an important grounding in emotional support and spiritual life. Pastor Wes's fellowship in Montgomery County joins a list of about five other fellowship groups he holds in facilities in Frederick.

"What I always enjoy most is building relationships with these residents, learning about their families, and praying with them," he says.
